### **APPENDIX** 1

Annotated checklist of Vascular Plants of Baker Woodlot, Michigan State University Campus, East Lansing, Michigan, U.S.A.

This checklist includes all taxa encountered in the recent 2010s inventory and those of the historic inventory in the 1970s (Stevens and Beach 1980). The sequence of taxa in the updated checklist is by major groups (pteridophytes, gymnosperms, monocots, primitive angiosperms, eudicots) with families alphabetically arranged, and species likewise within families. Family assignment of genera as well as nomenclature of species adopted here follows the classification in Voss and Reznicek (2012) and the frequently updated Michigan Flora online (Reznicek et al. 2020). Information from the recent inventory comes first under each taxon, with voucher specimens cited, followed by the 1970s information gleaned from Stevens and Beach (1980) along with the voucher specimens cited in that paper. In several cases, the nomenclature has changed, or specimen identifications were corrected/annotated; synonyms are indicated in parenthesis. All voucher specimens have been deposited in the Michigan State University Herbarium (MSC). State-listed Threatened or Endangered species are so indicated. There are three new county records: *Epilobium hirsutum* L., *Veronica filiformis* Sm., and *Galium odoratum* (L.) Scop.

An asterisk "\*" indicates a nonnative (exotic) species. A double dagger "‡" indicates species that have been planted, either before the 1970s inventory, or more recently. General directions are sometimes given for certain taxa within Baker Woodlot using cardinal (N, S, E, W) and ordinal (NE, SE, SW, NW) directions, and often combined with the abbreviation for central (cent.), as in N-cent. (north-central). Planted species, including ornamentals that are also native in Michigan, such as *Cercis canadensis* (redbud), were included in this comprehensive checklist of all vascular plant species but were excluded from the analyses presented in the text. It is important to account for both historical plantings and the possible persistence of recent plantings for future inventories of this highly valued natural area.

DRYOPTERIDACEAE (WOODFERN FAMILY)

- Dryopteris carthusiana (Vill.) H. P. Fuchs; spinulose woodfern Scattered through woods, moist soil; Crow 10518; Godden 2, 20; Walker 4. 1970s: (as Dryopteris spinulosa). Scattered in cent. and S-cent. woods; Stevens 963, 965, 967, 970, 971.
- *Dryopteris intermedia* (Willd.) A. Gray; evergreen woodfern Small populations, moist soil, under maples; *Walker 10.* 1970s: Not encountered.
- Polystichum acrostichoides (Michx.) Schott; Christmas fern Scattered clumps, rich woods, cent., E, and SE section woods; Godden 4; Rachwal & Walker 3; Smith 58. 1970s: Scattered in cent. and S-cent. woods; Beach 1138; Flanders 92; Stevens 969.

#### EQUISETACEAE (HORSETAIL FAMILY)

- Equisetum arvense L.; common horsetail S edge of woods in wet soil in ditch along railroad tracks, and SW corner on road embankment outside fence; Crow 10526, 10536, 10616; Godden 5; Rachwal & Walker 4. 1970s: SE corner woods; Disosway 23.
- *Equisetum hyemale* L.; scouring rush Not encountered. 1970s: Cent. woods; *Flanders* 168.

## OPHIOGLOSSACEAE (ADDER'S-TONGUE FAMILY)

- Botrypus virginianus (L.) Michx.; rattlesnake fern Not encountered. 1970s: (as
  Botrychium dissectum). Scattered, cent. and S-cent. woods; Flanders 64; Stevens

1970s: Scattered through woods, especially wet places; Flanders 73; Stevens 961.

#### OSMUNDACEAE (ROYAL FERN FAMILY)

Osmunda claytoniana L.; interrupted fern – W ponds; Chansler 37; Crow 10612. 1970s: Common around W ponds; Beach 1098B, 1182; Bordner 123; Stevens 959.

Osmunda regalis L.; royal fern – W ponds; uncommon, moist hollow S side of small pond along W fence, very wet soil at margin of pond N-cent. woods and swampy sites; Crow 10600; Godden 21. 1970s: Occasional, around W ponds; Beach 1098A; Stevens 957.

Osmundastrum cinnamomeum (L.) C. Presl; cinnamon fern – Uncommon, only seen in moist hollow S of small pond along W fence; Crow 10586; Godden 28. 1970s: (as Osmunda cinnamomea). Near edge of middle W pond; rare; Bordner 115.

PTERIDACEAE (BREAK FERN OR MAIDENHAIRFERN FAMILY)

Adiantum pedatum L.; maidenhair fern – Locally common, scattered, small populations rich W-cent. and S-cent. woods; Chansler 9; Godden 15. 1970s: Scattered, rich Scent. woods; Borden 116; Flanders 17; Stevens 962.

THELYPTERIDACEAE (MARSH FERN FAMILY)

- *Phegopteris hexagonoptera* Fée; broad beech-fern S-cent.; *Godden 16, 31.* 1970s: Not encountered.
- Thelypteris noveboracensis (L.) Nieuwl.; New York fern Wet swampy area, locally abundant, NW woods; Godden 26; Quimby 10. 1970s: Scattered throughout woods; Beach 1097, 1099; Bordner 124; Flanders 79; Stevens 958.

#### **GYMNOSPERMS**

#### CUPRESSACEAE (CYPRESS FAMILY)

- \*‡*Juniperus chinensis* L.; Chinese juniper Ornamental; planted on road bank edge between fence and Farm Lane; *Fung 32; Kolp 113.* 1970s: Not encountered.
- Juniperus communis L.; common juniper, ground juniper E side of NW pond, with Rosa multiflora, Lonicera spp.; Goch 244. 1970s: Not encountered.
- Juniperus virginiana L.; red cedar Single tree, S edge along railroad tracks; Goch 236; Rachwal & Walker 6. 1970s: Not encountered.
- *‡Thuja occidentalis* L.; white cedar, arbor vitae Not encountered. 1970s: Planted in NW corner with black walnuts; many surviving until 1970 when all but one removed by road construction; *Stevens 885*.

#### PINACEAE (PINE FAMILY)

- \*‡Pinus ponderosa P. Lawson & C. Lawson; ponderosa pine Locally common SW edge woods; Springer 1327. 1970s: S end of woods; planted; Beach 1120.
- *Pinus strobus* L.; white pine NE corner woods, outside fence; *Goch 44*. 1970s: Few, very stunted trees, W-cent. woods; probably planted; *Stevens 944*.
- \*‡*Pseudotsuga menziesii* (Mirb.) Franco; Douglas-fir Small stand of trees, S and W woods; *Goch 55; Kolp 6.* 1970s: Stunted trees, scattered in SW woods; planted; *Stevens 858*.
  Beech and Stevens (1979) indicated that the silviculture class planted Douglas-fir seedlings in 1925 along the west edge, assuming that a shade intolerant species could not persist in the dark understory; 50 years later a few dozen scraggly 1–2 inch diameter trees, mostly a few feet high, were barely hanging on. Yet, 90+ years later, a small stand of trees persists.

‡Tsuga canadensis (L.) Carrière; eastern hemlock – Not encountered. 1970s: Single small tree, N edge, probably a nursery relic; Beach 1005.

### TAXACEAE (YEW FAMILY)

Taxus canadensis Willd.; Canada yew – One small shrub, S and cent. trails, W side of woods; Chansler 19. 1970s: (as Taxus sp.). Several seedlings scattered in central woods; probably adventive; Stevens 1670.

\*‡Taxus cuspidatus Siebold & Zucc.; Japanese yew – Ornamental; NE corner woods off primary trail, possibly planted; Chansler 29. 1970s: Not encountered.

AMARYLLIDACEAE (AMARYLLIS FAMILY)

\*‡*Narcissus* cf. *pseudonarcissus* L., daffodil – Ornamental; planted by NW entrance;

Goch 57. 1970s: Not encountered.

ARACEAE (ARUM FAMILY)

- Arisaema triphyllum (L.) Schott; Jack-in-the-pulpit Common, moist soil, scattered in woods; Goch 63; Kolp 2. 1970s: Scattered through woods; Beach 1009; Flanders 45.
- *Calla palustris* L.; wild calla Locally abundant, emergent in large SW pond near W trail; *Crow 10614*; *Goch 118*. 1970s: Thriving in SW pond and partially covering it; *Stevens 1076*.
- Lemna minor L.; common duckweed Abundant, free-floating in N-cent. and W ponds; Crow 10514, 10519, 10609. 1970s: Abundant on W ponds; Beach 1197.
- Lemna trisulca L.; star duckweed Abundant, free-floating just below water surface in pond at N-cent. edge woods; Crow 10515. 1970s: Not encountered.

ASPARAGACEAE (ASPARAGUS FAMILY)

\*Asparagus officinalis L.; garden asparagus – Not encountered. 1970s: Adventive along E edge; Stevens 941.

CONVALLARIACEAE (LILY-OF-THE-VALLEY FAMILY)

   Springer 1313. 1970s: (as Smilacina stellata). S-cent. woods, uncommon; Stevens 311.

- Medeola virginiana L.; Indian cucumber-root Apparently rare, edge of SW pond; Godden 18. 1970s: Near SW pond, rare; Beach 1118.
- Polygonatum pubescens (Willd.) Pursh; downy Solomon-seal Scattered, NW and W side; Goch 74; Springer 1304. 1970s: Scattered in cent. woods; Beach 1213;
  Flanders 149, 207A; Stevens 330.
- Uvularia grandiflora Sm.; bellwort Cent. woods; Goch 66. 1970s: Scattered in cent. and S-cent. woods; Flanders 2, 53, 153; Stevens 295.

CYPERACEAE (SEDGE FAMILY)

- *Carex albursina* E. Sheld.; white bear sedge Uncommon, one plant along edge E trail and one clump along E–W trail, N side; *Crow 10592, 10632*. 1970s: Not encountered.

- *Carex bebbii* (L. H. Bailey) Fernald; Bebb's sedge Few plants, S in ditch along railroad tracks, normally wet but dry at collection; *Chansler 51*. 1970s: Not encountered.
- Carex blanda Dewey; eastern woodland sedge Common, throughout woods; Chansler
  4, 14; Crow 10587, 10598, 10605; Goch 253, 256; Kolp 92; Lincoln 11; Springer
  1308. 1970s: Scattered throughout woods; Stevens 332, 868, 903, 915, 1674.
- *Carex cephaloidea* (Dewey) Dewey; thinleaf sedge Not encountered. 1970s: Cent. woods, rare; *Stevens 973*.
- *Carex cephalophora* Willd.; oval-leaf sedge Uncommon, W section and SW end near trail entrance; *Kolp 10*; *Springer 1323*. 1970s: Along trail near W entrance, apparently rare; *Stevens 916*.

- *Carex crinita* Lam.; fringed sedge S woods, two plants, wet site; *Chansler 65*. 1970s: Not encountered.
- *Carex disperma* Dewey; softleaf sedge Locally abundant in swampy area, S-cent.; *Kolp* 85. 1970s: Not encountered.
- *Carex echinodes* (Fernald) P. Rothr., Reznicek & Hipp; quill sedge Rare, E-cent. woods and NW entrance to woods; *Kolp 14*; *Springer 1458*. 1970s: (as *Carex tenera*).
  Along drainage ditch in NW woods; *Stevens 910*.
- *Carex gracillima* Schwein.; graceful sedge Occasional, scattered in woods, of wet soil; *Crow 10583*; *Kolp 5, 31, 90.* 1970s: Scattered in woods, deep shade; *Beach 1075, 1096*.
- *Carex grisea* Wahlenb.; inflated narrow-leaf sedge Few individuals, S-cent. woods; *Kolp 13*. 1970s: Not encountered.
- Carex hirtifolia Mack.; pubescent sedge Scattered, S-cent. woods; Chansler 5; Crow 10527; Goch 251; Kolp 7, 84. 1970s: Not encountered.
- *Carex intumescens* Rudge; greater bladder sedge Few plants, wet sites, S-cent. woods; *Kolp 11.* 1970s: Cent. and S-cent. woods; *Beach 1052*; *Stevens 974, 1085C*.
- *Carex laxiflora* Lam.; broad looseflower sedge Scattered throughout; *Chansler* 6; *Kolp 16*, *80*, *83*. 1970s: Not encountered.
- Carex lupulina Willd; hop sedge Sparse, widely scattered in wet sites; Chansler 26; Kolp 18, 33; Smith 12. 1970s: Not encountered.
- *Carex normalis* Mack.; greater straw sedge Sparse, NW corner near fence, and E-cent woods; *Goch 100*; *Kolp 14*. 1970s: Not encountered.

- *Carex pensylvanica* Lam; Pennsylvania sedge Occasional, NW corner, W side and SE corner woods, sandy places, usually forming "lawn-like" patches; *Crow 10521, 10584*; *Goch 250.* 1970s: Sandy places in W woods; *Stevens 854*.
- *Carex radiata* (Wahlenb.) Small; straight-styled wood sedge or eastern star sedge –
  Occasional, scattered wet sites, S and S-cent., and margin of large pond N-cent.

- *Carex sparganioides* Willd.; bur-reed sedge Occasional, scattered widely throughout; *Crow 10617*; *Goch 151*; *Godden 13*; *Smith 8*; *Springer 1454*. 1970s: Wet places near cent. trail; *Stevens 973*.
- *Carex sprengelii* Spreng.; Sprengel's sedge Not encountered. 1970s: S-cent. woods; *Stevens* 867, 879.
- *Carex stipata* Willd.; awlfruit sedge Sparse, wet places, N section on margin of pond; *Chansler 11*; *Kolp 32*. 1970s: Not encountered.
- *Carex tenera* Dewey; quill sedge Sparse, scattered, especially near NW pond; *Chansler* 30. 1970s: Not encountered. Note that in Stevens and Beach (1980), the specimen

Stevens 910 was identified as *C. tenera*; it was later annotated as *C. echinodes* by A. A. Reznicek, a taxon only recently (in 2009) segregated as a distinct species—thus the specimen is cited under *C. echinoides*. As a consequence, *C. tenera* is listed herein as "new" to the flora.

- Scirpus pendulus Muhl.; rufous bulrush Few plants in pools of ditch along railroad tracks, S edge woods; Kolp 105. 1970s: Common, wet places along S edge; Beach 1089, 1164; Stevens 1578.

#### DIOSCOREACEAE (YAM FAMILY)

Dioscorea villosa L.; wild yam – Uncommon, NW corner at fence, edge of woods; Goch 278. 1970s: Uncommon in S woods; Flanders 107.

# HYACINTHACEAE (HYACINTH FAMILY)

- \*‡Hyacinthus orientalis L.; hyacinth Probably planted, open edge outside fence of NE entrance; Goch 60. 1970s: Not encountered. Not regarded by Voss and Reznicek (2012) as established in Michigan without cultivation.
- \**Muscari* cf. *botryoides* (L.) Mill.; grape-hyacinth Open edge outside fence of NE entrance; probably planted; *Goch 59*. 1970s: Not encountered.

# IRIDACEAE (IRIS FAMILY)

Iris virginica L.; southern blue flag – S edge and S-central, wet areas of ditch along railroad tracks, also along margin W pond; *Chansler 15*; *Springer 1344*. 1970s: Wet places along S-edge and in S-cent. woods, uncommon; *Beach 1027*; *Stevens 1535*.

### JUNCACEAE (RUSH FAMILY)

- *Juncus acuminatus* Michx.; sharp-fruited rush Not encountered. 1970s: (as *Juncus canadensis*). Wet places along S edge; the only specimen collected too young for positive identification; *Beach 1080*.
- Juncus canadensis J. Gay ex Laharpe; Canadian rush Wet places, S edge of woods in ditch along railroad tracks; *Goch 198.* 1970s: Not encountered.
- Juncus dudleyi Wiegand; Dudley's rush Occasional, wet soil, along eastern trail of woods, and along S edge of in ditch along railroad tracks; Kolp 104; Springer 1332. 1970s: Locally common, wet places along S edge; Stevens 1562.
- *Juncus tenuis* Willd.; path rush Common, along N trail, and NW corner along trail; *Springer 1376, 1453.* 1970s: Not encountered.
- Luzula acuminata Raf.; hairy wood rush Not encountered. 1970s: Scattered through drier parts of cent. woods; Stevens 275, 880.

# LILIACEAE (LILY FAMILY)

  [specimen badly degraded]; *Godden 33*. 1970s: (as *Cypripedium calceolus*).
  Three small groups of plants, S -cent. and SW woods, rare; *Flanders 60*; *Stevens* 870.
- \**Epipactis helleborine* (L.) Cranz; helleborine Very rare, S section of woods along fence row; *Godden 7.* 1970s: Not encountered.

*Galearis spectabilis* (L.) Raf.; showy orchis – Not encountered. 1970s: (as *Orchis spectabilis*). One group of 6 plants, rich S-cent. woods; *Stevens 335*.

POACEAE (GRASS FAMILY)

- Agrostis gigantea Roth; redtop Disturbed area outside fence, S section along railroad tracks; *Chansler 63*; *Smith 1*. 1970s: Occasional along N and E edges; *Beach 1115*; *Stevens 1601*.

- Brachyelytrum erectum (Roth) P. Beauv.; long-awned wood grass Uncommon, scattered N-cent. woods along trail, cent. woods, and S-cent. woods; Crow 10692;
  Goch 142; Kolp 40. 1970s: Scattered through woods; Beach 1043; Flanders 128, 210, 227; Stevens 1603B.
- \*Bromus inermis Leyss.; smooth brome NE entrance just outside fence, and W edge outside fence; Goch 121; Smith 16. 1970s: Common along E edge, waste places; Beach 1159; Stevens 1576.
- Bromus nottowayanus Fernald; satin brome S woods, sparse; Chansler 56. 1970s: (as Bromus pubescens). In S woods, uncommon; Flanders 88; Stevens 2100.
- Bromus pubescens Willd.; Canada brome Not encountered. 1970s: (as Bromus latiglumis). Cent. woods, rare; Stevens 968.
- \*Bromus tectorum L.; downy chess, cheat grass Single plant growing on embankment at railroad overpass SW corner just outside fence; *Crow 10615*. 1970s: Not encountered.

- *Calamagrostis canadensis* (Michx.) P. Beauv.; blue-joint Not encountered. 1970s: In wet places of ditch along railroad tracks at S edge; *Beach 1068*.
- *Cinna arundinacea* L.; wood reedgrass Uncommon; *Chansler 71; Smith 6, 10.* 1970s: Cent. woods, apparently rare; *Flanders 166*.
- \**Cynodon dactylon* (L.) Pers.; Bermuda grass E-cent. entrance, in open area; *Goch 311*. 1970s: Not encountered.
- \*Dactylis glomerata L.; orchard grass NW entrance near fence, common; Goch 265;
   Kolp 114; Springer 1378. 1970s: Common along path near main W entrance;
   Beach 1057.

- Symphyotrichum pilosum (Willd.) G. L. Nesom; frost aster, hairy aster S edge along railroad tracks; open field; Goch 238. 1970s: (as Aster pilosus). Common weed in disturbed places; Beach 1205; Stevens 803, 2124, 2126; Thomas 13.

- \*Taraxacum officinale F. H. Wigg; common dandelion NE corner at entrance, open field, and on maintained road bank of W edge, outside fence; *Fung 7*; *Goch 301*.
  1970s: Weed along edges and trails; *Stevens 865*; *Thomas 35*.
- \**Tragopogon dubius* Scop.; goat's beard S edge near railroad tracks, one large plant seen; *Springer 1342.* 1970s: Not encountered.

# BALSAMINACEAE (TOUCH-ME-NOT FAMILY)

Impatiens capensis Meerb.; spotted touch-me-not – S-cent. woods, and wet sites outside SE fence; Goch 150; Kolp 49. 1970s: (as Impatiens noli-tangere subsp. biflora).
Locally common in wet, disturbed places; Flanders 212; Thomas 40.

# BERBERIDACEAE (BARBERRY FAMILY)

- \*Berberis thunbergii DC.; Japanese barberry Scattered throughout; *Chansler 13*; *Goch* 5, 31, 141; Springer 1306. 1970s: Scattered through woods; Stevens 300.
- \*Berberis vulgaris L.; common barberry Not encountered. 1970s: Near NW pond, two vigorous shrubs; *Stevens 2170*.
- Caulophyllum giganteum (Farw.) Loconte & W. H. Blackw.; giant blue cohosh Rare,
   SE woods near S trail; Walker 2. 1970s: Stevens 296 (as Caulophyllum thalictroides, not then distinguished as two distinct species).
- *Caulophyllum thalictroides* (L.) Michx.; blue cohosh Frequent, scattered throughout N and cent. woods; *Crow 10613*; *Goch 65*; *Godden 10*; *Springer 1466*; *Walker 1*.
  1970s: Scattered through the woods, uncommon; *Grashoff 49*; *Stevens 804*; *Thomas 48*.

Podophyllum peltatum L.; may-apple, mandrake – Common throughout, forming large patches; Springer 1302. 1970s: Common, in large patches; Beach 1010; Ehrlinger 73; Flanders 7; Stevens 329.

BETULACEAE (BIRCH FAMILY)

*Carpinus caroliniana* Walter; hornbeam, blue-beech, ironwood – NW woods, pond shore; *Goch 98.* 1970s: Common in low places in S woods; *Stevens 287; Thomas 71.*

- *Corylus americana* Walter; hazelnut S edge along railroad ditch, and centrally outside fence; *Goch 41, 228.* 1970s: On S side near W edge of woods along railroad right-of-way; *Anderson 2354*.
- Ostrya virginiana (Mill.) K. Koch; hop-hornbeam, ironwood W-central, probably scattered throughout; Goch 50; apparently also planted as an ornamental on road bank, Fung 23. 1970s: Uncommon, scattered through woods; Stevens 288; Thomas 67.

# BIGNONIACEAE (CATALPA FAMILY)

\*‡*Catalpa speciosa* Teas; northern catalpa, cigar tree – S along railroad; *Goch 232*.
1970s: One large tree along E edge near drainage ditch, probably planted; *Stevens* 937.

#### BORAGINACEAE (BORAGE FAMILY)

Hydrophyllum appendiculatum Michx.; great waterleaf – Single colony of ca. 100 plants, woods near trail, NW ponds; Springer 1339. 1970s: Rare, along cent. trail; Stevens 342.

# BRASSICACEAE (MUSTARD FAMILY)

- \**Alliaria petiolata* (M. Bieb.) Cavara & Grande; garlic mustard Small patch on W trail in cent. woods; *Goch 109*. 1970s: Not encountered.
- \**Barbarea vulgaris* W. T. Aiton; yellow rocket S edge, margin of railroad ballast and ditch; *Springer 1328*. 1970s: Weedy along edges and trails; *Stevens 866*.
- \*Berteroa incana (L.) DC.; hoary alyssum Scattered, SW corner, open, disturbed site outside fence; Goch 109. 1970s: Drier disturbed places; Beach; 1055; Flanders 244; Thomas 26.
- \**Brassica rapa* L.; field mustard NE edge, outside fence; *Goch 58.* 1970s: Not encountered.
- \**Capsella bursa-pastoris* (L.) Medik.; shepherd's-purse NE entrance to woods, one plant seen; *Springer 1465.* 1970s: Weedy along N side; *Stevens 907.*
- Cardamine concatenata (Michx.) Alph. Wood; cut-leaved toothwort Abundant
   throughout, often forming large patches; Goch 52; Lincoln 1. 1970s: (as Dentaria laciniata). Common throughout woods; Grashoff 48; Stevens 274; Suttkus 13.
- *Cardamine douglassii* Britton; pink spring cress Uncommon; edge of vernal pool in cent. woods, wet soil on hummocks and base of large trees; Crow 10530, 10594, 10619; Kolp 72, 73. 1970s: Common in low wet areas of rich cent. woods; *Flanders 240; Stevens 323.*
- \*Erysimum capitatum (Douglas ex Hook.) Greene; western wall-flower Common, EC edge of woods, between woods and street; Springer 1336. 1970s: Not encountered.
- \**Hesperis matronalis* L.; dame's rocket E-cent. edge woods, between woods and street; *Springer 1337.* 1970s: Abundant in NW corner; *Beach 1227*; *Stevens 899.*

- \**Lepidium campestre* (L.) R. Br.; field cress Uncommon, S edge near railroad tracks and ballast; *Springer 134*. 1970s: Not encountered.
- *Lepidium virginicum* L.; common peppergrass Not encountered. 1970s: Occasional weed on E. edge; *Stevens 2146*.
- \**Lobularia maritima* (L.) Desv.; sweet alyssum NE fence at S entrance; *Goch 19, 18.* 1970s: Not encountered.
- \**Sisymbrium altissimum* L.; tumble mustard Not encountered. 1970s: Weedy along S edge and in NW corner; *Beach 1228*; *Stevens 1570*.
- \**Sisymbrium officinale* (L.) Scop.; hedge mustard One plant, disturbed area, SW corner near railroad overpass; *Warner 2*. 1970s: Not encountered.
- \*Thlaspi arvense L.; penny cress Edge woods, W-cent. area along fence; Goch 275.
  1970s: Weedy along N edge; Stevens 906.

CAMPANULACEAE (BELLFLOWER FAMILY)

- *Campanulastrum americanum* (L.) Small; tall bellflower, American bellflower Three small populations seen, S and S-cent. woods; *Chansler 60*; *Goch 189*; *Kolp 48*.
  1970s: (as *Campanula americana*). Scattered through woods; *Beach 1061*; *Flanders 101*; *Stevens 813*; *Thomas 17*.
- Lobelia cardinalis L.; cardinal-flower Not encountered. 1970s: On S edge in wet places along railroad ditch, rare; *Beach 1067*.
- Lobelia siphilitica L.; great blue lobelia Not encountered. 1970s: Scattered in S part of woods; *Beach 1139*.

CANNABACEAE (HEMP FAMILY)

- \*‡Cannabis sativa L.; hemp, marijuana Not encountered. 1970s: Several plants seen along E edge in 1974 (clearly planted earlier in summer); Beach 1288.
- *Celtis occidentalis* L.; hackberry NE corner and cent. woods, occasional; *Goch 28, 283*. 1970s: Uncommon, S woods near drainage ditch; *Stevens 855*; *Thomas 75*.

CAPRIFOLIACEAE (HONEYSUCKLE FAMILY)

- Lonicera canadensis Marshall; Canadian fly honeysuckle Not encountered. 1970s: Uncommon, along W trail; *Gillis 6484*; *Stevens 299*.
- Lonicera dioica L.; glaucous honeysuckle, red honeysuckle Scattered in woods, locally abundant; *Chansler 8*; *Crow 10610*. 1970s: Rare, in W woods; *Rabeler 128*; *Stevens 905*.
- \*Lonicera maackii (Rupr.) Herder; Amur honeysuckle SW corner and S-cent. woods near fence, scattered; Goch 104; Springer 1325; Walker 3. 1970s: Along edges in NE corner of woods; Beach 1021.
- \*Lonicera morrowii A. Gray; morrow honeysuckle Two shrubs in N section near pond; Kolp 29, 109. 1970s: Not encountered.
- \**Lonicera tatarica* L.; Tartarian honeysuckle Not encountered. 1970s: Scattered in disturbed places, especially near center of S edge; *Stevens 317, 902*.
- \**Lonicera* ×*bella* Zabel; hybrid honeysuckle S-cent. edge near fence and NE corner outside fence; *Goch* 83, 85, 217. 1970s: Not encountered.
- \*Lonicera xylosteum L.; European honeysuckle Not encountered. 1970s: Edge of woods near cent. W pond; Morse 5901.

Triosteum aurantiacum E. P. Becknell; horse-gentian – Two plants, S woods; Chansler
58. 1970s: Common in disturbed places, especially in NE woods; Anderson 2181;
Beach 1141; Stevens 1077.

CARYOPHYLLACEAE (PINK FAMILY)

- \*Cerastium fontanum Baumg.; mouse-ear chickweed NW corner outside fence, and S edge disturbed area along train tracks; Chansler 28; Goch 93; Springer 1374.
  1970s: Not encountered.
- \**Cerastium pumilum* Curtis; mouse-ear chickweed S section, open area near railroad tracks; *Kolp 94*. 1970s: Not encountered.
- \**Dianthus armeria* L.; Deptford pink Disturbed area, NW edge at fence, few plants seen; *Goch 307*; *Kolp 118*. 1970s: Not encountered.
- \**Saponaria officinalis* L.; bouncing bet, soapwort Not encountered. 1970s: Weedy along railroad tracks, dry soil, S edge; *Thomas 21*.
- \*Silene latifolia Poir.; white cockle, white campion NE entrance, outside fence, E edge outside fence, S edge along railroad tracks, and road bank outside fence; Chansler 20; Fung 11; Goch 119, 133; Kolp 88; Springer 1348, 1370. 1970s: (as Lychnis alba). Weedy along edges; Stevens 322; Thomas 31.
- *Stellaria longifolia* Willd.; long-leaved chickweed, long-leaved stitchwort Not encountered. 1970s: Uncommon, along S edge; *Stevens 1574*.
- \**Stellaria media* L.; common chickweed Not encountered. 1970s: Common in disturbed places, NE corner near entrance; *Stevens 860*.

CELASTRACEAE (BITTERSWEET FAMILY)

- Celastrus scandens L.; climbing bittersweet, American bittersweet S edge near railroad tracks; Springer 1345. 1970s: Common along S edge; Anderson 2261; Stevens 913.
- \*Euonymus alatus (Thunb.) Siebold; winged euonymus Scattered through woods, infrequent, often a single plant seen; Goch 87, 27; Kolp 35, 42, 65; Springer 1326.
  1970s: Not encountered.
- *Euonymus obovatus* Nutt.; running strawberry-bush S-cent. edge near fence, and NE edge near fence; *Goch 21, 84*; *Godden 1*; *Lincoln 3*; *Walker 5*. 1970s: Locally abundant, scattered through woods; *Beach 1071*; *Flanders 150*; *Stevens 352*.

CONVOLVULACEAE (MORNING-GLORY FAMILY)

\*Convolvulus arvensis L.; field bindweed – NW edge near road, four plants seen; Kolp
51. 1970s: Weed along S edge; Beach 1031.

CORNACEAE (DOGWOOD FAMILY)

- Cornus alternifolia L. f.; alternate-leaved dogwood Widely scattered; Goch 210; Kolp 114; Springer 1334. 1970s: Occasional in wet places throughout woods; Flanders 103, 192; Stevens 353.
- *Cornus amomum* Mill.; pale dogwood, silky dogwood S edge woods near railroad tracks; *Godden 1*. 1970s: Not encountered.
- *Cornus florida* L.; flowering dogwood NW woods near pond, uncommon; *Kolp 113*.
  1970s: Several small trees in SW woods; *Anderson 2350*; *Flanders 133*; *Thomas 66*; *Stevens 346*, 800.

*Cornus foemina* Mill.; gray dogwood – S edge of woods, open area with wet soil, near railroad tracks; *Springer 1354*. 1970s: Forming dense thickets around shaded pond margins; *Anderson 2356*; *Beach 1013, 1223*; *Stevens 1571, 815*.

DIERVILLACEAE (BUSH-HONEYSUCKLE FAMILY)

Diervilla lonicera Mill.; bush-honeysuckle – A few individuals, NW entrance area near fence; Goch 139, 264; Kolp 100; Springer 1377. 1970s: Occasional near entrance on W side, and a single shrub on S edge; Beach 1023; Stevens 950.

DIPSACACEAE (TEASEL FAMILY)

\**Dipsacus fullonum* L.; wild teasel – S edge near railroad tracks; *Goch 205*. 1970s: Not encountered.

\*Dipsacus laciniatus L.; cut-leaf teasel – S along railroad ditch; Goch 206. 1970s:

Occasional weed along S and E edges; Stevens 2131.

### ERICACEAE (HEATH FAMILY)

*Monotropa uniflora* L.; Indian pipe – Uncommon, W-cent.; *Goch 181*. 1970s: Not encountered.

#### FABACEAE (BEAN OR PEA FAMILY)

Amphicarpaea bracteata (L.) Fernald; hog-peanut – Small clump, cent. woods; Helling 1.
1970s: Scattered in S-cent. woods; Flanders 57, 74, 183.

\**Astragalus cicer* L.; Chick-pea milk-vetch – SW corner woods; *Chansler 33*. 1970s: Not encountered.

*‡Cercis canadensis* L.; redbud, Judas tree – Several planted on road bank outside fence on W side; *Fung 4, 15.* 1970s: Not encountered. Although a native understory tree, nearing the northern edge of its natural range in Ingham Co. (Voss and Reznicek 2012), this species is widely planted as an ornamental.

- *Desmodium paniculatum* (L.) DC.; panicled tick-trefoil Not encountered. 1970s: Uncommon, S edge near E side; *Beach 1165*.
- *‡Gymnocladus dioicus* (L.) K. Koch; Kentucky coffee-tree Planted along road bank, W side; *Fung* 27. 1970s: Not encountered.
- Hylodesmum glutinosum (Willd.) H. Ohashi & R. R. Mill; clustered-leaved tick-trefoil NW and N-cent. woods; Crow 10693; Goch 137; Godden 27. 1970s: (as Desmodium glutinosum). Common in cent. woods; Beach 1053, 1058; Flanders 69; Stevens 1615.
- Hylodesmum nudiflorum (L.) H. Ohashi & R. R. Mill; naked tick-foil Not encountered.
  1970s: (as *Desmodium nudiflorum*). Scattered through woods; *Flanders 106, 109, 159*.
- \**Lotus corniculatus* L.; birdfoot trefoil In lawn between forest and curb, NW corner; *Helling 7a, 7b.* 1970s: Occasional weed along N and E sides; *Flanders 46*.
- \*Medicago lupulina L.; black medick Road bank W side outside fence; Fung 3, 18.
  1970s: Not encountered.
- \*Melilotus albus Medik.; white sweet-clover NW edge road bank outside fence, and S along railroad ditch; Fung 2, 10; Goch 287. 1970s: Weedy along S edge; Thomas 23.
- \**Melilotus officinalis* (L.) Pall.; yellow sweet-clover Locally common, NE corner outside fence; *Goch 291*. 1970s: Weedy along S edge; *Stevens 1572*; *Thomas 45*.

- \*‡Robinia pseudacacica L.; black locust S-cent. edge near railroad tracks; Springer 1346. 1970s: Planted in old nursery along S edge, now adventive; Maas 534; Stevens 918. Beach and Stevens (1979) noted that the Michigan Agricultural College Annual Report of 1903 mentions that a few hundred locust tree saplings were planted in a burned over area on the south edge near the railroad tracks.
- \**Securigera varia* (L.) Lassen; crown-vetch NW corner, road bank, and SW corner near railroad tracks; *Chansler 32*; *Fung 14*; *Smith 29*. 1970s: Not encountered.
- \**Trifolium pratense* L.; red clover Beneath planted tree outside NE corner; *Fung* 25. 1970s: Not encountered.
- \**Trifolium repens* L.; white clover NE Corner outside fence; *Fung 17*; *Goch 292*. 1970s: Occasional adventive from field along S half of E side; *Thomas 37*.
- \*Vicia villosa Roth; hairy vetch NW corner, road bank outside fence; Fung 13, 36.
  1970s: Not encountered.

#### FAGACEAE (BEECH FAMILY)

- Fagus grandifolia Ehrh; American beech Common, especially N and cent. woods, scattered throughout; Goch 30; Kolp 61; Springer 1335. 1970s: A dominant tree in the drier areas of W woods, scattered elsewhere; Beach 1222; Stevens 883; Thomas 83.
- *Quercus alba* L.; white oak Common, scattered in drier woods; *Goch 271*; *Springer* 1470. 1970s: Common, especially in S woods; *Stevens 863a, 894*.
- *Quercus bicolor* Willd.; swamp white oak Few trees by small pond, NW edge within woods; *Crow 10608*; *Goch 207, 270.* 1970s: Common in wet places in S woods; *Stevens 847, 1085D*.

- *Quercus macrocarpa* Michx.; bur oak W-cent. near fence, and SW along fence *Goch* 51, 285. 1970s: A few trees in S woods; *Stevens* 863b, 2148.
- Quercus muehlenbergii Engelm; chinquapin oak SE woods along fence; Goch 284.

1970s: Rare, in SE woods; Stevens 2583.

*Quercus rubra* L.; red oak – Throughout woods, and planted on road bank W side, outside fence; *Fung 26*; *Goch 69*; *Kolp 124*. 1970s: Common in drier areas; *Beach 1128A*, *1145*, *1147*; *Stevens 321*, *857*.

GENTIANACEAE (GENTIAN FAMILY)

Gentiana and rewsii Griseb.; bottle gentian, closed gentian – Not encountered. 1970s:

Common in wet, shaded sites, S edge; Stevens 2107.

## GERANIACEAE (GERANIUM FAMILY)

Geranium maculatum L.; wild geranium – Common, scattered throughout; Goch 67; Springer 1301. 1970s: Scattered, especially in SE woods; Flanders 6; Stevens 351.

GROSSULARIACEAE (CURRANT OR GOOSEBERRY FAMILY)

- Ribes americanum Mill.; wild black currant Common throughout woods; Chansler 7; Crow 10531; Goch 77; Springer 1312. 1970s: Uncommon, near W entrance; Stevens 316.
- Ribes cynosbati L.; wild gooseberry, prickly gooseberry Frequent throughout woods; Chansler 2; Crow 10596; Goch 20, 140, 243; Godden 3. 1970s: Scattered in woods; Beach 1003; Stevens 302, 845.

 \**Ribes rubrum* L.; red currant – S edge of NW pond; *Goch 247*. 1970s: Not encountered.
 A widely cultivated species, but sometimes escaping into open or wooded sites (Voss and Reznicek 2012).

HALORAGACEAE (WATER-MILFOIL FAMILY)

Proserpinaca palustris L.; mermaid-weed – Locally abundant, submerged in pool along ditch by railroad tracks, S side; Crow 10537; Goch 201. 1970s: Not encountered.

HAMAMELIDACEAE (WITCH HAZEL FAMILY)

Hamamelis virginiana L.; witch hazel – Common understory tree throughout; also planted on road bank W side outside fence; *Fung 33*; *Goch 13*; *Kolp 75*, 077; *Lincoln 10*. 1970s: Common in SW woods; *Stevens 361*; *Thomas 34*.

HYDRANGEACEAE (HYDRANGEA OR MOCK-ORANGE FAMILY)

\*Philadelphus pubescens Loisel.; downy mock-orange – Ornamental; not encountered.
 1970s: A few large shrubs along N edge; ornamental shrub, relics of nursery;
 Stevens 939 (identified as Philadelphus coronarius).

HYPERICACEAE (ST. JOHN'S-WORT FAMILY)

\*Hypericum perforatum L.; Klamath weed, goatweed, common St. John's-wort – S edge; common, S edge woods between fence and railroad tracks; *Springer 1361*. 1970s: Occasional along the S edge; *Stevens 2122*.

*Hypericum punctatum* Lam.; spotted St. John's-wort – Few clumps, SE corner near railroad tracks; *Kolp 108*. 1970s: Occasional along S edge; *Stevens 1086*.

## JUGLANDACEAE (WALNUT FAMILY)

*Carya cordiformis* (Wangenh.) K. Koch; bitternut hickory – NE corner inside fence; *Goch 260.* 1970s: In S woods, apparently rare; *Stevens 2135*; *Thomas 73*.

- Carya ovata (Mill.) Sweet; shagbark hickory, shellbark hickory NW corner at fence, and NW pond margin; Goch 112, 267. 1970s: Uncommon; Stevens 893; Thomas 80.
- ‡Juglans nigra L.; black walnut NW corner; open area NW corner just outside fence, and NE corner at entrance, forest edge; Goch 138, 263; Kolp 63. 1970s: Planted in NW corner woods; Stevens 888; Thomas 79. Interestingly, Beech and Stevens (1979) noted that in 1910 a one-acre plot of alternating rows of Juglans nigra and Thuja occidentalis was established in the northwest corner of the woods, but due to road construction along the north edge in 1970, with changes impeding drainage, only about 50 black walnut trees were still present at the time of their inventory.

#### LAMIACEAE (MINT FAMILY)

- Agastache nepetoides (L.) Kuntze; yellow giant hyssop S-cent. woods; Goch 160. 1970s: Scattered in rich parts of woods; Anderson 2173; Beach 1116, 1142; Flanders 206.
- Blephilia hirsuta (L.) Benth.; wood mint S side of woods; S-cent. woods, and woods on S edge Goch 16, 157; Kolp 52. 1970s: Not encountered.
- Collinsonia canadensis L.; stoneroot, richweed, horse-balm Scattered throughout woods; Chansler 61; Crow 10691; Goch 183; Kolp 122. 1970s: Common in rich parts of woods; Beach 1117; Flanders 163; Stevens 2120; Thomas 9.
- \*Leonurus cardiaca L.; motherwort N side outside fence; Goch 128; Springer 1371.
  1970s: Single patch in disturbed area near NE corner; Stevens 1554.

- *Lycopus uniflorus* Michx.; northern bugle weed Edge of NW pond; NW pond margin; *Goch 180.* 1970s: Not encountered.
- Mentha canadensis L.; wild mint Dried vernal pool margin in S-cent. woods, and open area along wet railroad ditch on S. side; Goch 197, 202; Kolp 53. 1970s: (as Mentha arvensis). Occasional weed along S. edge; Stevens 2114.
- Monarda fistulosa L.; wild bergamot Open area, S side along railroad ditch; Goch 296. 1970s: Common in woods near S-cent.; Beach 1083; Stevens 1604.
- \**Nepeta cataria* L.; catnip, catmint NE entrance area, outside fence; *Goch 188.* 1970s: Not encountered.
- Prunella vulgaris L.; self-heal, heal-all S-central woods, and open area SE side outside fence; Goch 153; Kolp 50. 1970s: Occasional weed on edges; Beach 1070; Thomas 3.
- Scutellaria lateriflora L.; mad-dog skullcap Infrequent in poorly drained places, W woods; Chansler 55. 1970s: Scattered in S-cent. woods; Beach 1136; Flanders 216.

#### LAURACEAE (LAUREL FAMILY)

*Lindera benzoin* (L.) Blume; spicebush – Common shrub in low wet areas, especially N-cent. and W-cent. portions; *Goch 45, 53*; *Kolp 62, 67*. 1970s: Common in wet areas; *Grashoff 50*; *Stevens 270*; *Thomas 76*.

Sassafras albidum (Nutt.) Nees; sassafras – W-central woods; Goch 108. 1970s:
Scattered canopy trees throughout woods, and smaller trees common along E and S edges; Beach 1221; Stevens 306, 324, 362; Thomas 72.

MAGNOLIACEAE (MAGNOLIA FAMILY)

- Acer negundo L.; box-elder Small tree along fence on S edge along railroad tracks; Crow 10523; Goch 225. 1970s: Common along drainage ditch in SE woods, and in NW corner; Beach 1217, 1218; Stevens 279.
- Acer nigrum F. Michx.; black maple NE corner in woods, near entrance and cent.
  woods, in wet soil; Goch 298; Kolp 103. 1970s: (as Acer saccharum var. nigrum).
  Occasional throughout woods (specimens suggest integration with Acer saccharum); Beach 1187; Stevens 954.

- \*Acer platanoides L.; Norway maple Ornamental tree, known to spread; SW corner of woods near path; Goch 209. 1970s: Adventive or planted along N side; Duvendeck 61; Stevens 897.
- Acer rubrum L.; red maple Swampy area N-cent. woods, and W-cent. along fence;
   Goch 273; Kolp 68, 69. 1970s: Common, especially in wet places; Hamel 115, 116; Stevens 309, 896; Thomas 68.
- Acer saccharinum L.; silver maple Several large trees on pond margin of W-cent woods, and few small trees in damp soil just outside fence on S side along railroad tracks; Crow 10534, 10585. 1970s: Occasional in wet places in SE woods; Stevens 864.
- Acer saccharum Marshall; sugar maple Throughout the woods, dominant; Goch 23, 279; Kolp 60. 1970s: A dominant tree in all but the wettest places; Hamel 117, 118; Stevens 831, 864.
- ‡Aesculus glabra Willd.; Ohio buckeye Planted recently on road bank W side outside fence; Fung 29. A native tree, but apparently planted in this case; not documented as growing wild for Ingham Co. (Voss and Reznicek 2012). 1970s: Not encountered.
- \*Aesculus hippocastanum L.; horse-chestnut Not encountered. 1970s: One small tree, adventive in cent. woods; *Flanders 165*.

#### SAXIFRAGACEAE (SAXIFRAGE FAMILY)

*Micranthes pensylvanica* (L.) Haw.; swamp saxifrage – Not encountered. 1970s: (as *Saxifraga pensylvanica*). Rare, rich S-cent. woods; *Beach 1007*. *Mitella diphylla* L.; bishop's-cap – Not encountered. 1970s: Moderately common in rich S-cent. woods; *Flanders 24*; *Stevens 829*.

#### SCROPHULARIACEAE (FIGWORT FAMILY)

\*Verbascum blattaria L.; moth mullein – S edge woods, open area of railroad ballast and ditch; Goch 170; Kolp 25; Springer 1355. 1970s: Uncommon weed along E side; Stevens 2147.

\*Verbascum thapsus L.; common mullein – S edge along railroad ditch; Goch 163.
1970s: Common along S side; Stevens 2156.

## SOLANACEAE (NIGHTSHADE FAMILY)

*Physalis heterophylla* Nees; clammy ground-cherry – Not encountered. 1970s:

Uncommon along S edge in dry places; Stevens 1568.

\*Solanum dulcamara L.; woody nightshade – NE corner at entrance, pond margin in N woods, and S edge near railroad tracks; *Goch 122*; *Kolp 28*; *Springer* 1343.

1970s: Weedy around ponds; *Beach 1154*.

Solanum ptychanthum Dunal; black nightshade – Open area at edge of woods, NE corner outside fence; Goch 185. 1970s: Locally common in NE woods, opening caused by logging; Beach 1074; Flanders 213 (both identified as Solanum nigrum).

# STAPHYLEACEAE (BLADDERNUT FAMILY)

Staphylea trifolia L.; bladdernut – Locally abundant, S-woods; Chansler 62. 1970s: Rare, S-cent. woods; Stevens 881.

## ULMACEAE (ELM FAMILY)

*Ulmus americana* L.; American elm, white elm – Widely scattered throughout, and ditch along railroad tracks; *Chansler 21*; *Crow 10522*, *10524*; *Goch 33*, *115*; *Kolp 23*.

1970s: Once common in wet places, but mostly killed by Dutch Elm disease; *Stevens 901*.

Ulmus rubra Michx.; slippery elm, red elm – Disturbed places; Kolp 26. 1970s:

Occasional, in disturbed places; Stevens 861, s.n. (Sep 1973).

URTICACEAE (NETTLE FAMILY)

Boehmeria cylindrica (L.) Sw.; false nettle – NW pond margin; Goch 174. 1970s: Common in wet places; Flanders 126, 144, 147.

Laportea canadensis (L.) Wedd.; wood nettle – NW corner, N-cent. pond margin, and SW woods; Goch 6, 220; Springer 1375. 1970s: Common, especially in disturbed places; Flanders 80; Stevens 1616.

Pilea pumila (L.) A. Gray; clearweed – Wet area, E-cent. woods; Goch 229. 1970s: In wet disturbed places around ponds; Flanders 143; Heaton 48-73; Stevens 2098.

*Urtica dioica* L.; stinging nettle – NE corner woods at entrance; *Goch 145.* 1970s: Weedy in wet woods near center of S edge; *Flanders 204*; *Stevens 1608*.

## VERBENACEAE (VERVAIN FAMILY)

\*Verbena stricta Vent.; hoary vervain – Three plants seen, S section along railroad ditch; *Kolp 59.* 1970s: Not encountered. According to Voss and Reznicek (2012),
Michigan is within the usually described natural range for the species, but they regarded it as adventive in Michigan, with few collections known before 1940, but then apparently spreading rapidly in disturbed sites.

*Verbena urticifolia* L.; white vervain – Not encountered. 1970s: Occasional, along E side; *Flanders 110*; *Stevens 1599*.

VIOLACEAE (VIOLET FAMILY)

- Viola canadensis L.; Canada violet Scattered, locally abundant, E-cent., W-cent., and S woods near path; Goch 68; Godden 30; Springer 1311. 1970s: Near drainage ditch on E side; Flanders 102; Stevens 293, 318.
- Viola ×eclipes H. Ballard (Viola labradorica × V. striata); Ballard's violet Occasional,
  E side, in wet soil adjacent to vernal wet area, and S-cent. woods; Crow 10513;
  Kolp 9. 1970s: (as Viola conspersa). Rare, near S trail; Stevens 1081C.
- Viola pubescens Aiton; yellow violet N-cent. woods and N edge outside fence; Goch
  62; Springer 1300. 1970s: Common in all but the wettest areas; Beach 1002;
  Flanders 25; Stevens 319, 320.
- Viola rostrata Pursh; long-spurred violet Scattered, cent. and W side of woods; Goch 248; Springer 1320. 1970s: Occasional throughout the woods; Flanders 256; Stevens 297; Suttkus 14.
- Viola sororia Willd.; common blue violet Common throughout woods, and NE corner woods (just outside fence, locally common); *Crow 10528, 10529; Goch 70, 245; Kolp 70, 82.* 1970s: Occasional throughout the woods; *Flanders 9; Stevens 281, 285, 304, 334; Suttkus 2.*
- *Viola striata* Aiton; cream violet Local, S section of woods; *Goch* 68; *Kolp* 8, 86. 1970s: Rare, SE corner; *Atwood* 365.

### VITACEAE (GRAPE FAMILY)

Parthenocissus inserta (A. Kern) Fritsch; thicket creeper – NW corner at fence, and S woods by wet railroad ditch; Goch 277; Springer 1449. 1970s: (as Parthenocissus vitacea). Common along S edge; Stevens 156.

- Parthenocissus quinquefolia (L.) Planch.; Virginia creeper, woodbine Scattered, especially S woods; Goch 56, 290; Smith 26. 1970s: Common low vine; Stevens 2145.
- *Vitis aestivalis* Michx.; summer grape NW corner at fence, and NW pond shore; *Goch* 34, 266. 1970s: Forming dense thickets along E edge and occasionally within woods; *Flanders 140*; *Stevens 1555*.
- Vitis riparia Michx.; river-bank grape Open area at NW corner by fence and S-cent woods near fence; Goch 212, 261. 1970s: Scattered throughout woods, sometimes climbing into canopy; Beach 1016; Ehrlinger 76; Stevens 354.
